



## Poison Control Tips

- Child(ren) should not have access to peeling paint or chewable surfaces painted with lead-based paint
- Treat your cosmetics and personal care products as potential poisons and store in secure locations
- Read the product safety label and follow directions
- Have a working carbon monoxide detector
- Learn the toll free poison control center number (1-800-222-1222) and keep it near a phone
- Never leave poisonous products unattended while in use
- Test all home alarms, smoke, and carbon, every month and replace them every 5 years
- Do not mix cleaning products

## Poison Control Checklist

- Place all poisonous products up high on shelves and in secured areas
- Medication have child resistant caps
- Place all ant and roach pellets out of children's reach
- Place hazardous products in a locked cabinet
- Place laundry detergents and softeners out of children's reach
- Store cosmetic items - such as nail polisher remover, hair sprays, colognes - out of children's reach
- Memorize poison control number and leave the number near your phone

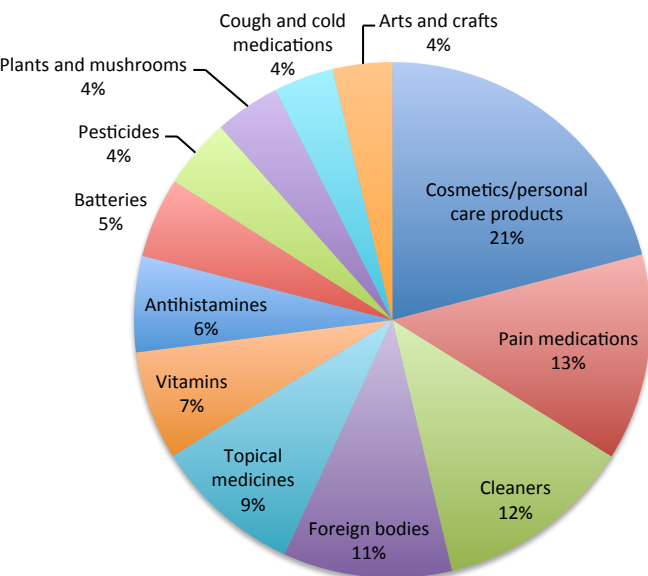




# The Facts

Small Children look at the world as a new playground where everything is new and there is plenty to explore. Each year, more than 2 million poisonings are report to the 57 poison control centers across the United States. More than 90 percent of these occur in the home.

The majority of non-fatal poisonings occur in children younger than six years old. And, poisonings are one of the leading causes of death among adults.



There are abundance of poiness sources in and around the home which can result in an poiness emergency.



The chart below shows all the different sources which can lead to potential poisoning. Each year after 1999, an average of 101 children ages 14 and under died as a result of unintentional poisoning.

It takes just one incident to cause harm to a child. However, it takes only one or two safety products to help protect and keep your child safe from those same incidents occurring.

Of the approximately 2.4 million human exposure cases received by Poison Control Centers in 2010, children under age 3 were involved in almost 40 percent; more than half of calls involved children ages 5 and under.

Medication safety caps can help prevent your child from opening and taking the medication. Simple push down and twist techniques can help add protection.

### CARBON MONOXIDE DETECTOR



Carbon monoxide detectors can

Help detect the build up of carbon monoxide in your home. Carbon monoxide is a odorless, clear gas that can cause death. A simple detector will send off an alarm, letting everyone know of the deadly build up.
